Why we love it...

The Weeping Acacia is an elegant and breathtaking tree. It grows slowly to maturity at about twenty-five feet, donning magnificent, weeping branches of silvery-blue foliage. Small, yellow puffball flowers, a classic characteristic of the Acacia family, may appear in early spring and winter.

Following flowering, the blossoms transform into small seedpods, filled with seeds that are a valuable food source for birds and other local wildlife. This patio-sized tree is a lovely choice for narrow locations, or perhaps in an empty corner as a statuesque accent with its tall, vertical growth habit.



Lydia says: Plant weeping acacia in a location with extremely well-draining soil to ensure that its roots are not sitting in water.

Evergreen Tree: *Acacia pendula*

Size (H x W): 15-25 feet x 15-25 feet

Blooms: Pale yellow in winter and early spring

Exposure: Full sun to part shade

Hardiness Zone: 20° F, USDA Zone 8

Water: Low to moderate

Pruning: Spring, after flowering

Growth Rate: Slow to moderate
