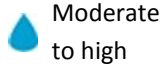


# MALUS X DOMESTICA 'ANNA'

## Anna Apple



Moderate to high



Full sun to part shade



Attracts butterflies



Native to N. America, Europe, & Asia

### Why we love it...

Maxing out at maturity between 15 and 25 feet, the Anna apple is a great tree for any garden, large or small. Exquisite pink and white blossoms emerge out of an entirely bare tree in early spring, followed by ripening fruit in early to midsummer.

Anna apple's fruit is medium sized with green skin kissed by a slight red blush. It is wonderfully crisp; not too sweet, not too tart; making it an excellent multipurpose apple for eating right off the tree, cooking, or baking. The Anna Apple is self-fruitful, meaning it doesn't need a second tree to produce fruit. However, yield can be increased by planting a second tree such as the 'Golden Dorsett' Apple.



**Lydia says:** The Anna Apple comes to us from Israel, a cross developed between an Arabian and an American Apple for its ability to produce a good crop, even in warmer climates. It only requires 200-300 chilling hours, perfect for the Tucson area.

### Edible:

*Malus x domestica 'Anna'*

**Size (H x W):** 15-25 feet x 15-25 feet

**Blooms:** White and pink in spring

**Exposure:** Full sun to part shade

**Hardiness Zone:** -20° F, USDA Zone 5

**Water:** Moderate to high

**Pruning:** Winter

**Growth Rate:** Moderate to fast
