Why we love it...

In the desert southwest, there are relatively few plants, and even fewer vines, that give our gardeners the joy and drama of fall color changes. That's why we're excited to offer Hacienda Creeper, a cold hardy vine that delivers lots of seasonal interest! Shiny new leaves emerge with a bronze color in spring and change to a deep lime green that contrasts beautifully with its red stems throughout the summer. In fall, they take on crimson to burgundy hues, and in protected areas these colorful leaves may cling to the vine through the winter, dropping just before new leaves appear again in spring.



Lydia says: Hacienda Creeper can help to keep buildings cool when grown against a wall, makes a dense screen when trained along a fence, and controls erosion when used as a groundcover.
